Note:

This drawing is part of a larger series of drawings of soldiers, Seurat's so-called *Brest Notebooks*. The Schwabing Art Trove also contains a heliographic reproduction of this sheet (LostArt-ID: 478199).

Félix Fénéon (1861–1944) was a famous French art critic and political activist in Paris. He coined the term "Neoimpressionism" to denote the group of artists led by Georges Seurat, and championed their works. From 1907 until 1925, Fénéon served as artistic director at the Galerie Bernheim-Jeune.

A first sale of the Fénéon collection took place at Hôtel Drouot on 4 December 1941. After his death in 1944, his estate was sold at Hôtel Drouot at three consecutive sales in 1947.

This drawing was shown at the Galerie de France in late 1942. The exhibition catalogue includes a special mention of Félix Fénéon, who is acknowledged "despite his distance from Paris" as the "most erudite of guides," having contributed to the show his knowledge and papers on Seurat. Further research is necessary.

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
