Eugène Rodrigues (1853–1928) was an attorney in Paris and a collector of art, with a focus on old master drawings. A first sale, which included this work, was handled by the Dutch dealership Frederik Muller & Cie. in 1921. Following Rodrigues' death, the remainder of his collection was dispersed at two estate sales at Hôtel Drouot in Paris, on 28–29 November 1928 and 25–26 February 1929 respectively.
