Photograph no. 7.1_F799 is a reproduction of this work; inscribed on verso, a typewritten statement of authenticity by the art expert André Schoeller of Paris, 13, Rue de Téhéran, dated 26 May 1942. This document shows that the work was on the market in the 1940s in occupied France; there is a high probability that Gurlitt acquired the work during that period.
