**Note:**

Paul Wallraf (1900 Cologne–1981 London) was a member of the famous banking family of Cologne. Wallraf came to England in the 1930s, where he was active as a marchand amateur. A first sale of Wallraf property was held in Paris in 1933. Research is on-going to establish the buyer of this work at that sale.

A large part of the Wallraf collection was acquired en bloc in 1962 by Robert Lehman and is now at the Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York.

The personal papers found in Cornelius Gurlitt's Salzburg home include a collection of 2,400 photographs of artworks. Photograph no. 12.1\_F12190 is a reproduction of this work.

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
