Note:

The object is a copy or forgery of an ancient Egyptian relief in the style of the New Empire.

The personal papers found in Cornelius Gurlitt's Salzburg home include a collection of about 2,400 photographs of artworks. Photograph no. 17.1_F17126 is a reproduction of this relief, as mounted on a pedestal; inscribed on recto: "39".

This object has sustained extensive fire damage, as have many of the ancient artefacts in the Schwabing Art Trove. Time and circumstances of this damage are currently unknown (cf. Lost Art ID nos. 521788–521799, 521805, 521806, 521809, 521814, 521815).

The photograph shows the pre-fire state.

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
