According to the inscription on verso, this work was a present from Corot to his student at the École des Beaux-Arts, Pierre Emmanuel Damoye (1847–1916). In 1882, Damoye in turn gifted the work to his friend Louis de Fourcaud (1851–1914), a prominent art critic and professor at the École des Beaux-Arts.

A reference to one Corot drawing titled *Fuhrwerk unter hohen Bäumen* can be found in the correspondence of Hildebrand Gurlitt. It was sent to a restorer in January 1948.
