The personal papers found in Cornelius Gurlitt's Salzburg home include a collection of about 2,400 photographs of artworks. Photograph no. 12.1_F1275 is a reproduction of this work; on verso, inscribed: "0.35 x 0.12 Courbet 'Les Mouettes' Un côté de la boite de peinture de l'artiste" and "8441", with signature and stamp of the art dealer Raphaël Gerard of Paris, 4, Avenue de Messine, dated 22 May 1942. This document shows that the work was on the market in the 1940s in occupied France; there is a high probability that Gurlitt acquired the work during that period.
