### Note:

This drawing was traditionally considered one of a pair, the other being Delacroix' *Two Men* (Lost Art ID: 478189).

This work, and its counterpart, was among over 70 works with the art dealer Raphaël Gérard in Paris in 1944. It is unclear whether at the time Gérard and/or Gurlitt owned or co-owned these works, whether they had been placed on commission, or indeed simply deposited with Gérard. It is conspicuous that an inventory of works with Gérard was drawn up in the very late stages of the war; one possible hypothesis is that Gurlitt placed for safekeeping with Gérard works that he had acquired in occupied Paris, with the intention of moving these objects at a later date.

In 1953, some of these works were shipped to Gurlitt in Dusseldorf, while others remained with Gérard until 1957 (at Gurlitt's cost). There are two known inventories of artworks with Gérard, dated 28 April 1944 and September 1953 respectively. This work is referred to herein as "DELACROIX: Deux dessins" (1944) and "Delacroix: Pendant von 11b" (1953).

The personal papers found in Cornelius Gurlitt's Salzburg home include a collection of about 2,400 photographs of artworks. Photograph no. 7.1\_F709 is a reproduction of this work; inscribed on

verso, a handwritten statement of authenticity by art expert André Schoeller of Paris, 13, rue de Téhéran, dated 25 January 1944.
