Note:

Per stamp on verso, this painting was temporarily stored, during the Nazi era, in a customs-bonded warehouse (in German: "Niederlage") of the Hauptzollamt Berlin Packhof, the central customs office in Berlin. The primary purpose of a customs-bonded warehouse is to ensure the payment of customs duties on imported goods.

The label "Regal 23[3]" (on frame verso) indicates the painting's specific location in the storage facilities of the Wiesbaden Central Collecting Point in the immediate post-war period.

The personal papers found in Cornelius Gurlitt's Salzburg home include a collection of about 2,400 photographs of artworks. Photograph no. 7.1_F753 is a reproduction of this work; inscribed in pencil on verso "Hildebrand".

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
