This work was originally owned by Eugène Blot (1857 Paris–1938 Paris), a Parisian dealer, bronze founder and art collector. It was offered for sale at the Vente Blot in 1933 but was bought in, according to the auction records preserved at the Archives de Paris.

The possible provenance that was tentatively assigned to the artwork in the course of its seizure, and later published on Lostart.de, requires further research.
