According to the Database "Entartete Kunst," the Städtische Kunsthalle Mannheim owned another impression of this plate [EK Inv.-No. 6116] which was sold to Harald Holst Halvorsen, Oslo, in 1938 and is therefore not identical with the current work found in the Schwabing Art Trove.
