Silver, minted, diameter: 11–31 mm

Coin A, obverse: Dionysus, reverse: Heracles

Coins B + E, obverse: Heracles, reverse: Zeus enthroned

Coins C + D, obverse: Satyr and Nymph, reverse: incuse square

Coin F, obverse and reverse changed, obverse: Gorgoneion, reverse: Head of Nike

Coin G, obverse: kneeling cow (?), reverse: incuse square
